Maxolon's action in restoring normal gastro-duodenal motility² is of great benefit to all who suffer peptic ulcer symptoms, including those patients with no demonstrable pathology, and post-operative cases.

Maxolon provides a rational method of treatment not afforded by either antacids or anticholinergics. These relieve symptoms by lowering acid levels in the stomach. Maxolon promotes gastric emptying¹, and thus removes both the stimulus to secrete and the excess acid present in the stomach. In this way it also relieves the symptoms of "over-fullness".

Maxolon's effect of synchronising antral and duodenal contractions² is even more significant in treating peptic ulcer symptoms.
