ANTIBIOTICS AND THE INTESTINAL FLORA

Treatment with broad spectrum antibiotics suppresses the normal flora, which may be replaced by abnormal resistant organisms causing diarrhoea.

This change can be prevented or reversed by the implantation of *Lactobacillus acidophilus* which has been rendered antibiotic-resistant, and is thus able to multiply freely under these abnormal conditions. 
