SURGERY OF THE ACUTE ABDOMEN JOHN A. SHEPHERD

Second Edition 754 pages 111 illustrations £5 10s.

This was an outstanding book when it originally appeared in 1960 and the second edition is most welcome. It provides a scholarly, clear and comprehensive account of all the acute abdominal conditions which one can expect to meet. It is the work of one experienced and thoughtful surgeon and every section is convincing and authoritative. Mr Shepherd is to be congratulated on a splendid piece of work. This is an excellent book, well worth the price, and should be owned and read by everyone who undertakes emergency surgery.

THE 'SPHINCTERS' OF THE DIGESTIVE SYSTEM

L. J. A. DIDIO and M. C. ANDERSON 270 pages 138 illustrations £7

The authors by devoting this book to the mechanisms which control the flow of food and secretions through the digestive tract, have presented an entirely new approach to problems related to this system. Included are the concepts related to the various levels which contain mechanisms for opening and closing, and thus perform an indispensable role in the control of flow in the digestive tract. Clinical considerations are presented in detail in order to focus on motility abnormalities in relation to various recognized disease states and to emphasize the significance of abnormalities which in part or wholly are related to the gastrointestinal tract are also given some attention.

GASTRO-INTESTINAL X-RAY DIAGNOSIS

A Descriptive Atlas D. H. CUMMACK

360 pages 1,009 illustrations £8 10s. The book consists of chapters on The Barium Meal, The Gastrografin Meal, The Oesophagus, The Stomach, The Duodenum, The Small Intestine, The Appendix, The Colon, The Biliary Tract, The Pancreas, The Liver, The Abdomen. At the beginning of each chapter there is a short text written in the form of a monograph from the author's personal experience. This has been mainly obtained while working in the Western General Hospital, Edinburgh during

the last 21 years in close association with the physicians and surgeons, in particular members of the Gastro-Intestinal Unit.

The illustrations, totalling approximately 1,000, follow the text of each chapter and include most diseases and conditions. Many interesting, unusual and hitherto unrecorded cases which have been seen during the past years are described and discussed. Some illustrations are for the purpose of aiding the interpretation of radiological techniques. There is a considerable amount of new material particularly in the investigation of the acute abdomen, haematemesis etc. The author's technique is described in detail when there is something new or original to offer.
